PREACHING OF THE WORD

SCRIPTURE: *1 Thessalonians 2:17-3:5*

¹⁷But since we were torn away from you, brothers, for a short time, in person not in heart, we endeavored the more eagerly and with great desire to see you face to face, ¹⁸because we wanted to come to you—I, Paul, again and again—but Satan hindered us. ¹⁹For what is our hope or joy or crown of boasting before our Lord Jesus at his coming? Is it not you? ²⁰For you are our glory and joy.

¹Therefore when we could bear it no longer, we were willing to be left behind at Athens alone, ²and we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith, ³that no one be moved by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this. ⁴For when we were with you, we kept telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction, just as it has come to pass, and just as you know. ⁵For this reason, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain.

SERMON: “Not Settling for Separation”

Writing His Word on our hearts: 1 Thessalonians 5:8-10

⁸“But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, having put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. ⁹For God has not destined us for wrath, but to obtain salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, ¹⁰who died for us so that whether we are awake or asleep we might live with him.”

1. Gospel ministry is personal and relational.

Orphanos - “one who is torn away”

2. We have an enemy who desires to separate and isolate us.

3. We are strengthened when we hear about one another's faith and share one another's burdens.

²¹When they had preached the gospel to that city and had made many disciples, they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch, ²²strengthening the souls of the disciples, encouraging them to continue in the faith, and saying that through many tribulations we must enter the kingdom of God."

Acts 14:21-22 (see also Acts 15:31 & 18:23)

4. Our perspective is shaped by the One who came to us and is coming again.

Parousia - "at His coming"

Application: Staying connected and encouraging one another by sharing our faith and burdens are worth the effort and inconvenience.
